MYP Dress Code Policy



MYP Dress Code Policy - *Updated for 2025/26 school year*

Students are to comply with the Dress Code for all in-school and out-of-school classes, public occasions, and school/class excursions.

In the event of a student not being dressed appropriately and his/her parents cannot be reached, students will be provided with something to wear by the school.

Dress Code Must Haves:

- Clothes should be appropriate for the learning environment and daily activities.
- All outdoor clothing is to be removed and placed in the student's locker during the school day.
- House shoes/slippers must be worn in school(*except for students who require medical insoles*).
 - MYP 3 and 4 students transitioning campuses may wear outside shoes downstairs, but **MUST** change before coming upstairs.
- Underwear must be covered by clothing.
- Tops need straps (tube/bandeau tops are not appropriate)
- During PE lessons, children must change into appropriate PE clothes and shoes. Long hair needs to be tied back.
- For safety reasons, all jewelry must be removed before the PE class begins.
- Every Monday and Tuesday students have to wear the school t-shirt in any colour sold in the school's shop (dark green, dark blue, black, grey and white; and the NASA shirt) <http://www.abis.school/main-shop-page/>
- During field trips or excursions students have to wear the green t-shirt.
- For safety reasons, no large earrings and nail extensions are allowed for PHE, Science labs, the Arts and Design

Dress Code Don'ts:

- No hats and/or headgear will be worn in the school building at any time (*except for religious purposes or with special permission*).
- No pajamas
- No clothing with inappropriate words or images
- No accessories that could be considered dangerous or harmful to self or others
- No bare feet or only socks.

While fashion and style may change over time, the purpose of attending school remains the same: students are here to learn. Any clothing or accessories that disrupt the learning environment will not be allowed. If a student's appearance



causes a disruption or poses a risk to themselves or others, they will not be allowed to participate in class or activities until the issue is addressed.
